Hunter Reynolds  
February 21 – April 3, 2004**

Mary Goldman Gallery is pleased to announce an exhibition of new work by Hunter Reynolds on view from February 21 through April 3, 2004. An opening reception for the artist will be held on Saturday, February 21, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Hunter Reynolds has created a series of photo weavings- large panels comprised of hundreds of individual photographs that are sewn together. In one piece, images of the ocean, capturing the waves and the sunlight that reflects from the water's surfaces, symbolize the power and monumentality of an expansive seascape. The title piece for the exhibition, *The Moon Over Gerhard*, a tribute to a recently deceased friend, incorporates images of the moon's light reflecting on the ocean and surrounding environment in Southern Florida. A third piece uses images of a hospital room as taken through the eyes of the patient, including details that capture the experience of time spent alternating between fear and hope.

Individually, the photographs capture single, definable images and moments in time for the artist. Viewed as a whole, these moments become pieces of a larger visual experience that leaves the viewer contemplating the forces of nature and their power to evoke humility, spirituality and awe.

Hunter Reynolds is a seminal AIDS activist, visual and performance artist who was one of the founding members of ACT-UP and ART-Positive. He has performed extensively nationally and internationally in the Patina du Prey Memorial Dress. Selected exhibitions include The Schwulen Museum Germany, Thread Waxing Space, Marianne Boeskey Gallery, Paula Cooper Gallery, 1997 Documenta, Kassel, White Columns, New York, and Yerba Buena Center for the Arts, San Francisco. This is the artist's second exhibition at Mary Goldman Gallery
